

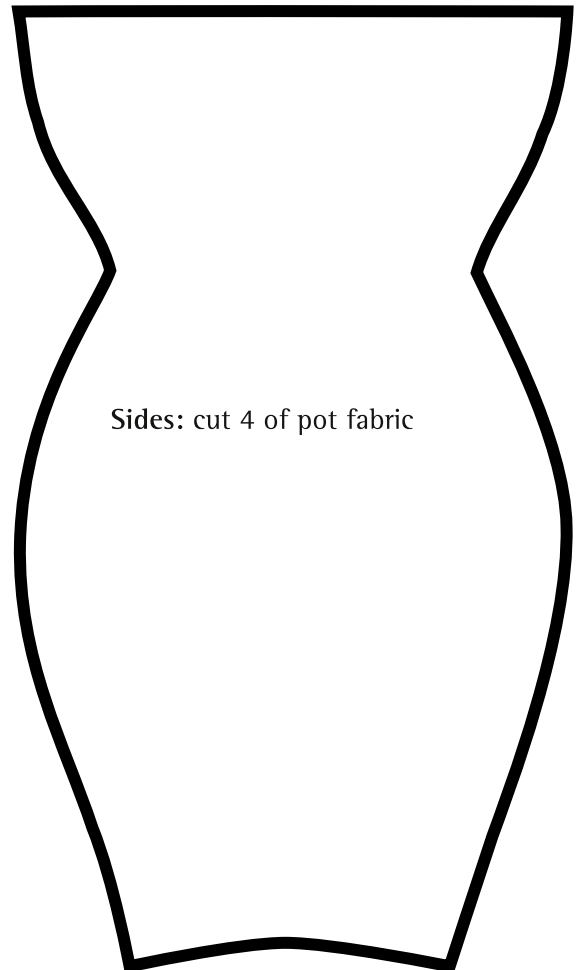
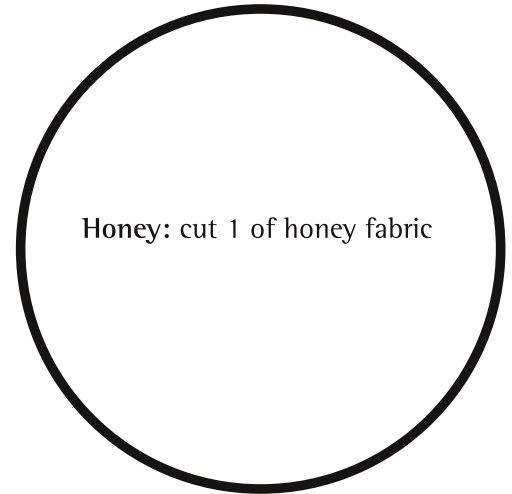
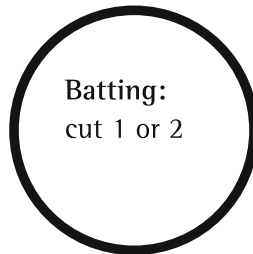
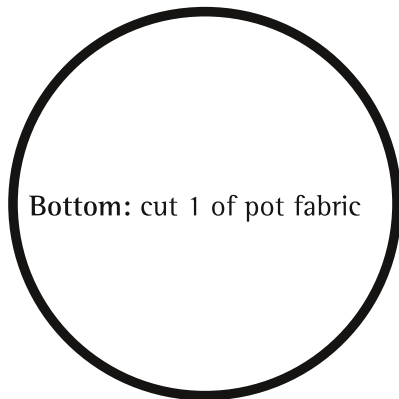
Honey Pot Pincushion

Materials:

- 2.5" circle honey colored fabric
- approx 5.5"x15" or 6"x14" pot colored fabric
- one or two 1.25" circles batting
- two 1.5" diameter plastic rings
- stuffing: sawdust, fiberfill, etc.
- needle and thread
- sewing machine optional



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Instructions:

1. Sew pot sides into tube using a 1/4" seam allowance.
2. Sew pot bottom to base of tube using a 1/4" seam allowance.
3. Secure plastic ring to inside pot bottom.
4. Make running stitch around pot 1.75" from top edge. Gather in until opening is a circle not much more than 1" in diameter and secure thread.
5. Lay second plastic ring on top of gathers and stitch in place.
6. Fold top end of pot inside to cover ring and form rim. Secure with a few stitches. Fill pot with stuffing material.
7. Make running stitch around honey fabric approximately 1/4" in from edge.
8. Center batting on wrong side of honey fabric and draw up running stitch to gather fabric. Add stuffing, if needed, on top of batting when fabric is nearly gathered down flat, then finish gathering and secure. Make a few stitches across opening to keep fabric contained.
9. Lay honey gathered side down on top of pot and secure by hand stitching around edge.
